Following the lunch, Keith who is a Maxonian born and bred, entertained us with a review of his life in music, accompanied by snippets of various pieces on the keyboard, which Geoff Blamire had provided for the afternoon.

Keith learned the piano from the age of seven. His mother only permitted him to go and play out with friends when he had done his half-hour daily practice! During his formative years he sang in the choir at York minster, and when in the army he started and led a choir of his fellow recruits. Keith has clearly had a varied life with music the driving force. The former headmaster of Upton Priory and Ivy Bank spoke about receiving the MBE from the Queen in 2008, and his role as conductor of the Oriana Choir.

Keith concluded his talk by having members shout out numbers from 1–70. He then playing the song that tallied with the list of 70 songs he had written down, all pieces he knew off by heart. There was just time for him to tell a few jokes, which were all very well received by the audience.
