Pass It On

Kay Evans has suggested including a column with useful facts in the newsletter and has provided the following piece to start us off. While none of us perhaps vapes, we may know of friends or family members who do, so next time you see them you could mention this.

"I had a visitor recently who vaped, and I wasn't sure what to do with the cartridges so asked my bin men which bin I should put them in (the grey receycling bin or black bin). They had no idea and suggested I phone Cheshire East Waste Disposal who also had no idea.

"I then phoned my local Bollington Town Council Office where a very nice lady, Barbara, spent quite a while investigating. She informed me that ONLY the *disposable* ones can be put in the black bin. ALL OTHER battery vape cannisters should be taken to the local Recycling Tip and put in the ELECTRICAL collection bin, but that the batteries should be removed.

"The thought of the millions that will end up in landfill is quite horrifying to me, given the strong plastic they are made from. Many vapers will not care that they should be recycled at the local tip in the electrical waste. I do hope that I'm wrong! PLEASE pass on this information to others.
