This month's outing is to the Grade 1 listed Piece Hall and Museum, Halifax. This 18th-century cloth hall now houses history exhibits, shops, bars and restaurants. We will have a guided tour of the Hall and can also visit the Museum. Both are fully accessible for disabled visitors.

The cost will be £20 for members and £25 for quests. Please note that we need a minimum of 26 attendees to make the cost of hiring the coach viable, so the outing will ONLY go ahead if we have sufficient numbers.
